

What's changed for young people leaving care nationally after 10 years of National Standards? Not a lot. Our latest report followed on from our previous research into the experiences of young people leaving care, and over the past 10 years, while we've seen jurisdictional successes, steps in the right direction like Victoria implementing HomeStretch, and we've seen marginal improvements in some areas such as education, young people leaving care are continually disadvantaged overall.

Our latest report shows that First Nations young people are generally further disadvantaged in 4 key areas, compared to non-Indigenous young people. These are: education, youth justice engagement, absence from placements, and becoming parents younger. Outside of these areas, all young people in care face similar levels of disadvantage when it comes to life domains like housing, life skills, mental health and support.
