We've been presenting our research in public at the Voices in Action conference, the SNAICC conference, and in the media. Sharing stories of young people being resilient, remarkable, and resourceful in a system that is hard to navigate. We've also been working closely with Governments all over Australia to ensure they are hearing the voices of young people. They have been saying with an even louder voice that the system needs to be better to create safe, inclusive, and empowering lives for young people.

The Post-Care report is still our priority report that we continue to share with Governments because there are still states and territories that don't support young people in care until 21. Here's looking at you Queensland and New South Wales! Our Queensland CREATE team had the exciting opportunity to be a part of history in the making. The legislation was amended and a new Bill passed that gives a right to children and young people to have a say in decisions that affect their lives, essentially to have a voice.

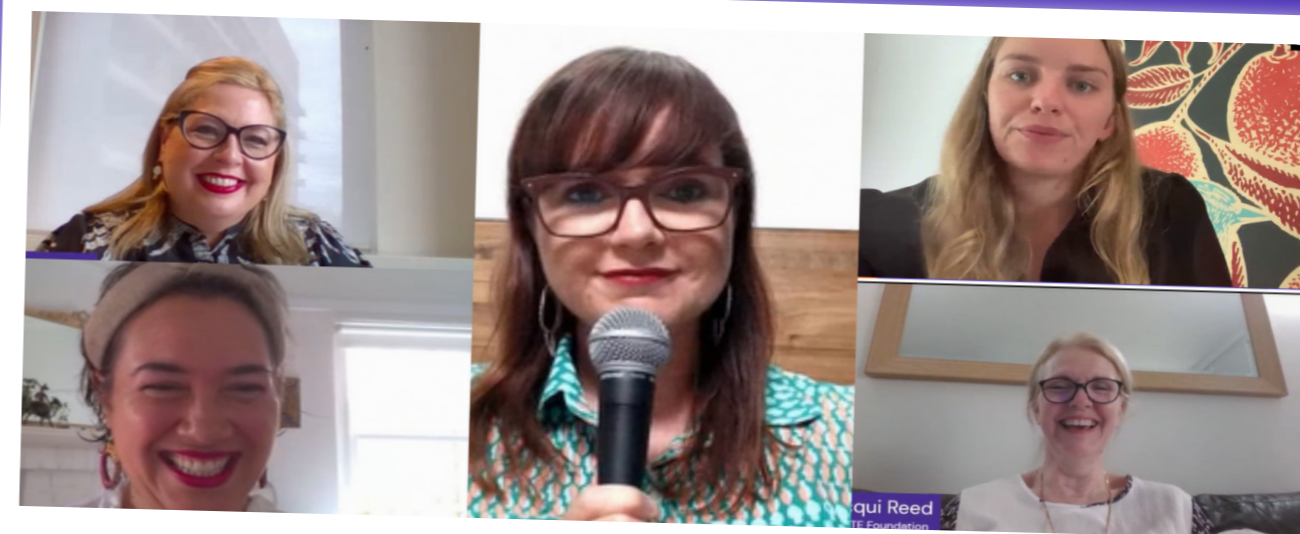
Day Three, Thursday 28th April

ON ELI

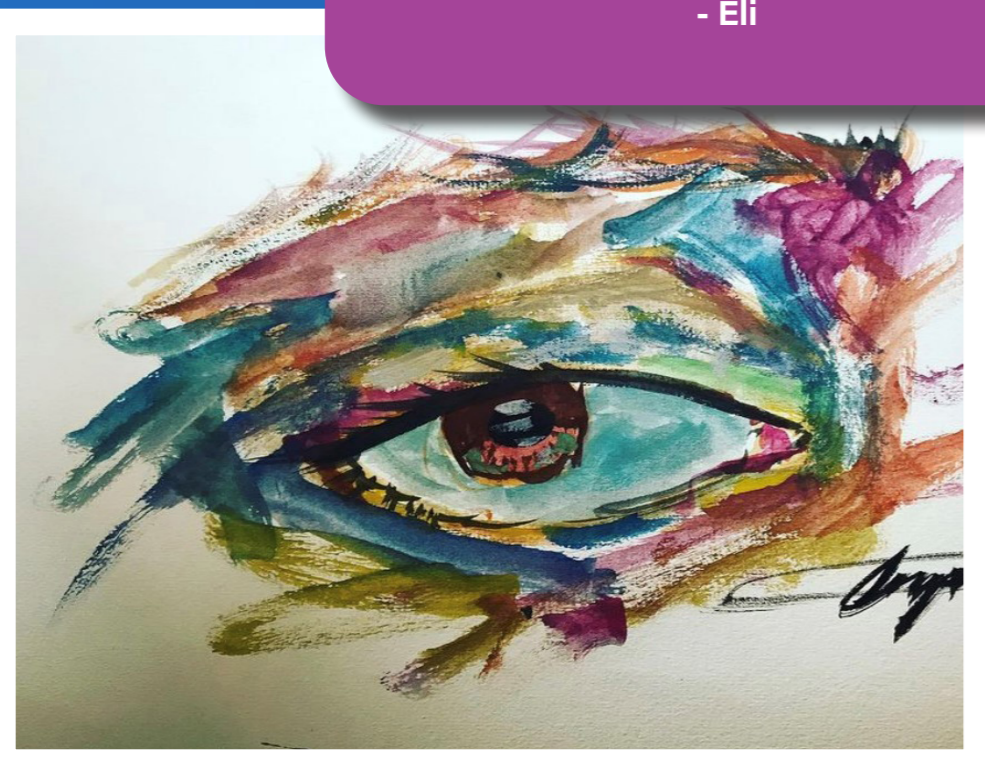

MEET A CREATE MATE!

We sat down with Amanda Poglits, the Advocate for Children in Care in western Australia and a CREATE Mate to get to know her and her role a little better.

Tell us about yourself! What's your role?

Firstly, I am a Yamatji / Noongar woman from the Western Australian region. I grew up in a small town called Three Springs. My role is the Advocate for Children in Care for the Department of Communities in Western Australia. As an Advocate I like to talk to young people in care about things that are happening for them that they might like to change and then I talk to the department on their behalf for change to happen. There are times when parents, carers or case managers might talk to me about their concerns as well so that we may think a little differently so that young people's voices are heard.

Why are you a CREATE Mate?

I believe in our young people and want them to have any and every opportunity to become the people that they want to be. CREATE is always there for our young people, doing some

really cool things and I want to be cool too, so if there is anytime that I can hang out and be a part of whatever is happening here in WA then I am there. That way I also get to hear the incredible things you are doing and share experiences with you. I love how CREATE brings together other wonderful people from other organisations who also want the best for young people and if we can work together then there are so many more opportunities out there for our young people.

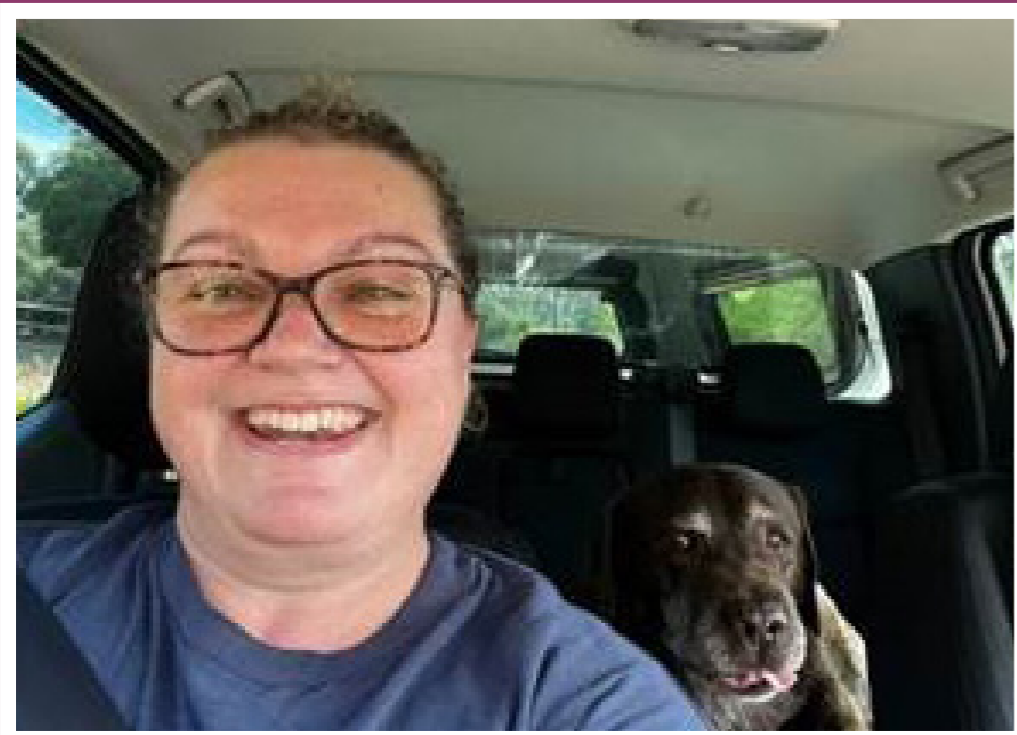
What's something you're passionate about in the care sector? What's something you're proud of?

LET'S TALK TAX

brought to you by Sortli, an app to help you get sorted!

If you're earning an income through a job or benefits from the government, you'll probably need to pay income tax. This is just a fact of adult life. Those taxes go towards helping pay for our hospitals, roads and schools. If you find tax a little confusing, don't worry - you're not alone! Here's some information you should know:

Do I need to pay Tax?

How much tax you pay depends on how much you earn. You're allowed to have income of up to \$18,200 each year without paying income tax. However, if your income is more than \$18,200 then you will probably have to pay tax. If you work for someone, income tax is automatically deducted from your wage and paid directly to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) - so you don't need to worry about that. Each year you then lodge a Tax Return to work out if you have paid enough or too much tax that year. If you pay more tax than you need to, you will get a Tax Refund.

How do I lodge a Tax Return?

You can lodge online using myTax, through a registered tax agent or complete a paper tax return. Your tax return covers the income year from 1 July to 30 June. If you need to complete a tax return you must lodge it or engage with a tax agent, by 31 October.

Need help lodging a tax return?

The ATO has a Tax Help Program which is free and helps people lodge their tax return online. From July to October each year, trained volunteers help people lodge their tax returns online. To make an appointment, phone 13 28 61 (select option 3, then option 2) to find Tax Help services near you.

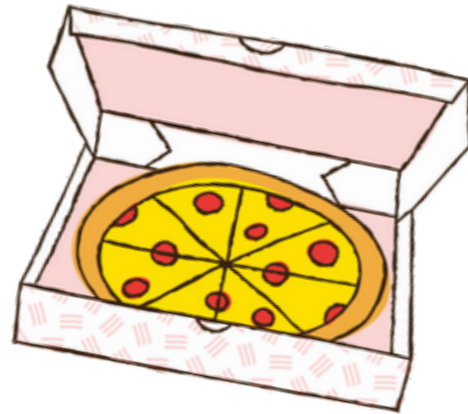


ACT ROUND UP

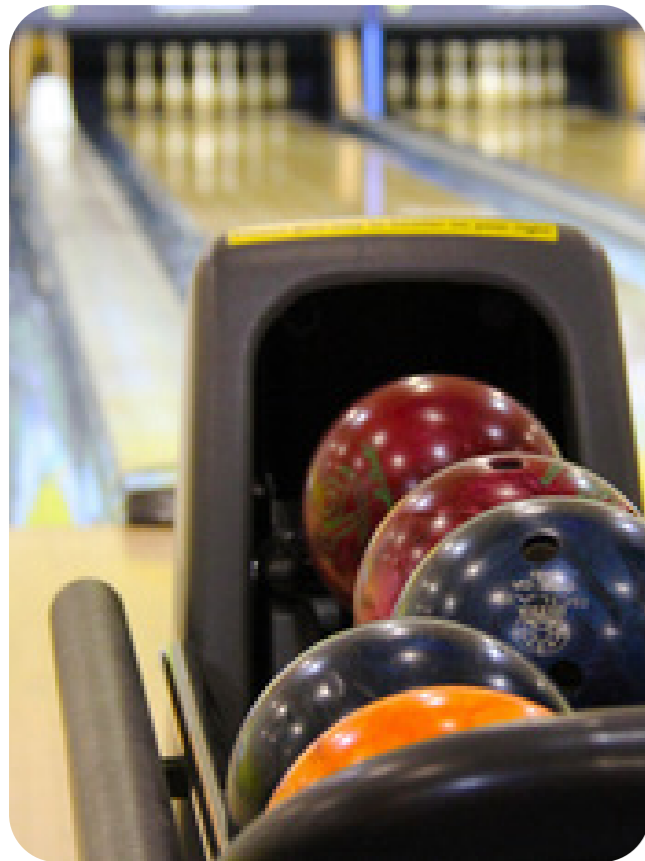
What's been happening?

Let's not forget the launch of the issues paper at the Transition into Independence Forum (TIF) which was emceed by Leticia, a proud Wiradjuri woman. Taya and Matthew did an amazing job on the forum panelists with other sector professionals. We talked about some of the barriers to accessing financial support from leaving care plans with young consultants sharing their experiences and emphasised the need for consistency during this process. This was echoed in the report's recommendations to have processes that ensure equity in leaving care and financial plans. A highlight was hearing how Speak Up had supported young people with the skills to advocate for themselves.

On that note, it was amazing to see one of our YC's fresh out of Speak Up share valuable insights on what needs to change systematically regarding engaging with caseworkers and emphasised listening to the child's voice which we put in action at the Voices in Action Conference.

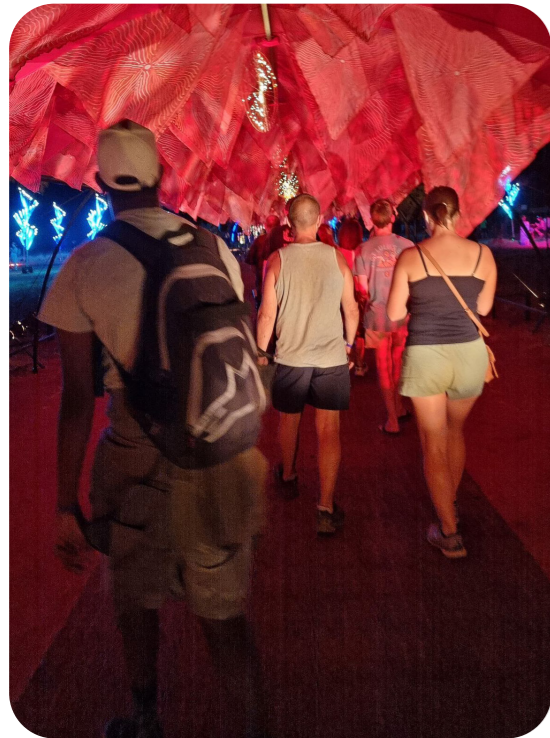


NT ROUND UP

What's been happening?
