UPDATE ON

SPMAKEIT21

In case you missed the news (unlikely as we have been celebrating loudly on social media!) but in June, young Queenslanders in out-of-home care received life-changing news from the Palaszczuk Government announcing the option to remain in their current care placements till 21 years of age. Until now, when a young person turns 19, their supports ended and they were left with no alternative

but to leave care. We are now working with the department and young people to help shape what that support will look like when it gets implemented in 2023. Watch this space!

We are now focusing on the New South Wales government! The last state to pledge their support to young people up to the age of 21. CREATE Foundation urges the Perrottet Government to listen to, and try to understand the issues that young care leavers face, and support young people till they reach the age of 21, regardless of if they are in foster, kinship or residential care.





When did you get involved with CREATE?

I have been connected with CREATE since I was 11 years old. I have been extremely involved with CREATE and helped to advocate to have our voices heard. I plan to stay with CREATE as long as possible because they have helped me connect with friends and like-minded people. I am now seen and heard. I want to keep advocating for as long as possible to help other young people transition into adulthood.

You recently attended Parliament when the historic Bill passed that gives the right to children and young people to have a say in decisions that affect their lives - what was that like?

My experience at Parliament house was one I will always remember. We felt welcomed by Minister Leanne Linard. It has been amazing to be a part of this historical moment for Queensland.

With Queensland making so much progress on the #makeit21 Campaign, how do you feel about New South Wales showing the same support to care leavers?

States that have not made this change, like New South Wales need to catch up. It sucks that they haven't realised how important 'make it 21' is and that the young people need this. It's amazing Queensland has this, but the New South Wales government should feel embarrassed.

#SNAPTHATSTIGMA

We sat down with Ruby, a clubCREATE member in Victoria to chat about her smashing her goals with a Scholarship to study a Diploma in Journalism!

What has your schooling experience been like?

When I was in residential care, I dropped out of mainstream school due to bullying and learning difficulties. I soon realised that I needed to complete high school one way or another. After 2 years of studying, I am now in the second trimester of my diploma at Deaking College Burwood and have learned so much.

What does this scholarship mean to you?

Getting this scholarship is like a weight lifted from my shoulders. As I'm turning 21 this year, I won't have the out-of-home care support I usually get. This scholarship gives me hope that future students with a care experience and I can strive and achieve anything and everything we put our minds to. It's important to show it doesn't matter where you come from or what your past looked like you can do anything.



What is your plan for 5 years from now?

I recently decided that it was time to work on figuring out who I am outside of Journalism and advocating for youth, so I hope in 5 years I've discovered a different passion allowing myself to grow.

MEET CREATE MATE JO SPANGARO

Tell us about yourself! What's your role?

I am a Professor of Social Work at the University of Wollongong, where I currently lead the academic team teaching the social workers of the future. I also research interventions to address sexual or domestic violence. My current major project is a study with refugee settlement services supporting women who have experienced domestic violence.

Why are you a CREATE Mate?

I first encountered CREATE many years ago, before it was even known as CREATE when I was a social work student and was struck by the work CREATE does and the articulate voices of young people who have left care.

What's something you're passionate about in the out of home care sector? What's something you're proud of?

Giving social work students a deeper understanding of the impacts of growing up in out of home care is a passion of mine, particularly appreciating the negative effects of multiple carer changes and the importance of listening to children and young people about where they want to live. I'm proud of the ways I have worked to ensure students understand in particular how we need to do much better to respect Aboriginal children, young people and families.

Everyone's a bit wacky in their own way - what's a fun fact about you? I'm a kelpie tragic. For me, they are the perfect dog. I love their devotion and how they find joy in simple things - like putting their head out the car window in the wind.





FIRST NATIONS ARTIST

During NAIDOC Week, we came across Kerry, a beautiful local artist who is both a First Nations woman and a carer. She shared with us a wonderful piece of artwork that has a very powerful meaning behind it. We will let her tell us her story of "Since Time Immemorial".

I created this piece the day the Federal Government purchased the rights to the Aboriginal flag for all Australians.


I created this piece to reflect what the flag means to me. The flag was created during a time of great activism, calling for recognition, land rights, human rights, health rights, education rights, and political rights.

For me, the flag represents our struggles, strengths, connections, and identity.

Balbal balbal (sun) with white circles and markings protect this giver of life.

White lines coming out of the sun like electricity, bring light, life, and energy to bama (people).

Bubu (country) with layers of three arches. Each arch represents past, present and future generations. The layers are endless, for we are the oldest continuous culture, 'Since Time Immemorial."





When you start to plan for your transition to adulthood, it's important to work with your support team and the Department to get access to your key identification documents and get linked up to important support services. Sometimes the process of getting access can be challenging and confusing, so to help, we have listed 10 essential steps to get you started ready for independence.

Download Sortli where you get all your good apps from.

- . Get your own Medicare Card
- 3. Set up your MyGov account
- 4. Get a Student ID from your school
- 5. Get a Proof of Age Card
- 6. Request a Tax File Number
- 7. Open your own Bank Account
- S. Set up a Centrelink Account
- 9. Submit a Housing Application (if you need it)
- Ask for your files and leaving care Documents






Aboriginal Cultural Connection Event

What's been happening?

Snap that Stigma with Dee Dee

"Hi, I'm Dee Dee, I'm 18 years old and currently doing Year 12. At age 6, I came into foster care. After being in two different places in the first two weeks, I was placed with a third family for potentially 1-3 months. I never left, 12 years later, I am gratefully still with them. I joined CREATE in 2020, during the Covid lockdown. I am part of MYAG and have completed all three levels of Speak Up. I've had wonderful encouragement and opportunities to achieve my best. At CREATE my motivation is to share my experiences and hope that all children in out of home care can have what I have had. I am fortunate to have been surrounded by a very supportive family, school, teachers, and coaches, who have believed in me. I participated in many different activities whilst trying to find my place in life swimming, netball, athletics, basketball, callisthenics, singing lessons and choir. I did better at some than others. To date, I have been privileged to represent Victoria on ten occasions in Cross Country (2), Athletics (4) and Netball (4). Recently, I was part of the Victoria Netball 19U team winning the bronze medal at Nationals in Hobart."
